



**FIRE: South of Canim Lake Wildfire (C41100)**

**FIRE SIZE:** 2,673 hectares (mapped)

**FIRE STATUS:** Out of Control

**RESOURCES:**

There are currently 40 firefighters, 19 pieces of heavy equipment, 22 structural protection personnel and there are 15 helicopters available to continue to action the fires within the Northeast complex with bucketing activities.



**UPDATES:**

- The crews have made progress establishing containment lines around the fire. There were crews monitoring the fire last night.
- Crews will continue to work to establish a 10 ft blackline where the fire has burnt to the guard, and they will patrol areas that have been blacklined. Heavy equipment is working to finish the south guard. Crews are working to lay hose in the southwest and working along the edge of the gully.

**EVACUATION ALERTS AND ORDERS:**

The Evacuation Order issued by the Cariboo Regional District for the south side of Canim Lake remains in place. The north side of Canim Lake remains on Evacuation Alert.

**FIRE: Flat Lake (C41602)**

**FIRE SIZE:** 32,194 ha (mapped)

**FIRE STATUS:** Out of Control

**RESOURCES:**

There are currently 89 firefighters, 53 pieces of equipment, 23 structural protection personnel and there are 15 helicopters for the Northeast complex.

**UPDATES:**

- There was moderate fire behaviour with some growth in the south and southwest.
- Highway 97 remains open. Check Drive BC for the most up-to-date information.
- With the expected weather forecast for the next few days, crews can safely conduct direct attack operations.
- Today, heavy equipment will be working to gain access and establish indirect control lines on the east flank near Davis Lake working from Bullock Lake Road moving northwards to the Gustafsen guard. If conditions permit, ignitions are planned for a small area north of Davis Lake. Crews will be mopping up in and around the residences in the vicinity of 83 mile on Highway 97. Crews will be working north of stormy road to remove available fuels between the fire and the guard.
- On the north end, crews will be working to connect existing road systems in the vicinity of Gustafsen and Neilson Lakes.
- There are 15 helicopters available to continue to action the fires within this complex with bucketing activities.
- Structural protection specialists continue to support the residences and properties on the Bullock Lake Road.

## FIRE: Succour Lake (C41191)

**FIRE SIZE:** 1600 ha (C41395 and C41191 merged) (estimated)

**FIRE STATUS:** Out of Control. This will be the last update as a Wildfire of Note.

### RESOURCES:

BC Wildfire Service will continue to monitor this fire and respond if necessary. There are 15 helicopters available to continue to action the fires within the 100 Mile Northeast Complex with bucketing activities.

### UPDATES:

- Fire C41395 has merged with fire C41191 and the total combined size is 1600 hectares.
- The fire continues to have minimal growth; however, it is putting up smoke that is visible from surrounding areas as it burns additional fuels in a nearby cutblock.
- There are natural wetlands, lakes and less volatile forest fuel features provide containment on two sides as well as the Lang Lake FSR to the north.
- Planning for machine guard construction is underway that will utilize these natural features and provide additional containment.
- Structural protection equipment continues to be deployed for a nearby residence.

### EVACUATION ALERTS AND ORDERS:

## FIRE: 1km NW of Irish Lake (C41088)

The C41088 wildfire, located 1km NW of Irish Lake near Lone Butte is currently Being Held meaning that sufficient suppression action has been taken that the fire is not likely to spread beyond existing boundaries. This fire continues to produce smoke as areas within the fire perimeter continue to burn, however this is normal fire behaviour and is not cause for concern.

The BC Wildfire Service has been supporting the Lone Butte Fire Department in responding to this fire. The sprinkler line was effective and the BC Wildfire Service and the Lone Butte Fire Department continue to monitor the fire.

**WEATHER**

**Friday:** Variable cloudiness. Areas of smoke. Winds becoming W- SW 8-12 km/h in the early afternoon. A few afternoon gusts of 20 km/h. Maximum 22°C, minimum RH 26%.

**Saturday:** A flat upper ridge in a southwest flow will prevail over the Fire Centre. Fairly sunny with no rainfall or lightning forecast. Winds will be light, and more thermally, and terrain driven. Temperatures will creep back towards seasonal with highs in the low to mid-twenties; min RHs in the 20's or low 30's.

**Sunday:** The ridge weakens, and a weak Pacific front will give clouds and possibly a slight chance of showers for the 100 Mile zone. Right now, expect any measurable precipitation to remain to the north. Winds look to be quite light Sunday. Temperatures dropping a little to the low twenties; min RHs in the 20s or 30s.

BC Wildfire Service	Emergency Management BC	Local municipalities and regional districts	First Nations
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- BCWS's jurisdiction covers all BC Parks, Crown and private lands, but does not include the boundaries of local governments that have forest fire prevention bylaws and are serviced by a fire department.</li> <li>- BCWS speaks directly about <b>wildfires</b> (i.e. fire status, operations, etc.) and is responsible for disseminating wildfire updates to local governments, stakeholders, First Nations and the public.</li> <li>- BCWS does <u>not</u> announce Strategic Evacuation Orders or Alerts.</li> <li>- BCWS <u>does</u> announce Tactical Evacuations.</li> <li>- In the event of an imminent threat to public safety, BCWS can authorize an immediate <b>Tactical Evacuation</b> of the affected area.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- EMBC coordinates communication across all agencies and stakeholders to support communities.</li> <li>- EMBC provides advice to evacuees and support to communities regarding Emergency Operations Centres and Emergency Support Services.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Local Municipalities and Regional Districts speak directly about <b>Strategic Evacuation Orders and Alerts in</b> their respective jurisdictions.</li> <li>- Local Municipalities and Regional Districts <u>do not</u> speak about the status of a wildfire unless the fire occurs within their jurisdiction. For example, if a wildfire <u>starts</u> within the boundaries of a local government, BCWS will often assist the local fire department with suppression efforts. If the fire spreads into Crown land to become a wildfire, BCWS will often assume control.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- On IR lands, Evacuation Orders and Alerts are implemented by a Band Council Resolution or other.</li> <li>- A designated person(s) from the respective First Nations community will speak to Evacuation Orders and Alerts on IR lands.</li> </ul>
