

DISTRICT OF 100 MILE HOUSE – 2026 MUNICIPAL ELECTION

Are you eligible to vote in the October election? Is your name on the current list of electors? If you are not sure you can find out by calling 250-395-2434 or visiting the District of 100 Mile House office at #1 – 385 Birch Avenue.

As per District of 100 Mile House Bylaw #1391 the most current available Provincial Voters list as prepared under the Elections Act shall become the register of resident electors.

ELECTOR QUALIFICATIONS

RESIDENT ELECTORS:

- ✓ 18 years of age or older on general voting day for the election or assent voting; and
- ✓ a Canadian citizen; and
- ✓ a resident of British Columbia for at least 6 months immediately before the day of registration; and
- ✓ a resident of the District of 100 Mile House
- ✓ not disqualified under the *Local Government Act* or any other enactment from voting in an election or assent voting and not otherwise disqualified by law.

NON-RESIDENT PROPERTY ELECTORS:

- ✓ 18 years of age or older on general voting day for the election or assent voting; and
- ✓ a Canadian citizen; and
- ✓ a resident of British Columbia for at least 6 months immediately before the day of registration; and
- ✓ a registered owner of real property in the District of 100 Mile House for at least 30 days immediately before the day of registration; and
- ✓ not entitled to register as a resident elector; and
- ✓ not disqualified under the *Local Government Act* or any other enactment from voting in an election or assent voting and not otherwise disqualified by law; and
- ✓ if there is more than one registered owner of the property, only one of those individuals may, with the written consent of the majority of the owners, register as a non-resident property elector.

LIST OF REGISTERED ELECTORS

Beginning September 1st until the close of general voting for the election on October 17th, a copy of the list of registered electors will be available for public inspection, at the District of 100 Mile House office in #1-385 Birch Avenue, during regular office hours, Monday to Friday, excluding statutory holidays. Before inspecting the list, a person must sign a statement that they will not inspect the list or use the information included in the list except for the purposes of Part 3 – Electors and Elections of the *Local Government Act*. An elector may request that their address or other information about them be omitted from or obscured on the list of electors.

REQUEST TO OMIT OR OBSCURE

An elector may request that their address or other personal information about them be omitted from or obscured on the list of electors. The elector must contact the Chief Election Officer or the Deputy Election Officer to make this request.

OBJECTION TO REGISTRATION OF AN ELECTOR

An objection to the registration of a person whose name appears on the list of registered electors may be made in accordance with the *Local Government Act* until 4:00 pm on September 10th. An objection must be in writing and may only be made by a person entitled to be registered as an elector of the District of 100 Mile House and can only be made on the basis that a person whose name appears on the list of electors has died or is not qualified to be registered as an elector of the District of 100 Mile House.
