MEMORIAL TREE PROGRAM



Trees may be purchased by individuals who wish to donate a tree to the District in Memory of someone who has passed away.

Requests from individuals for species and sites will be given full consideration by the staff, but the final decision in this regard rests with the District's Operations Supervisor who takes into consideration issues such as height, soil condition, safety, compatibility, ease of watering and other horticultural restraints. Sites for commemorative trees are chosen in consultation with District Staff. Once a site and a species have been agreed upon, the donor must make full payment by debit card, cheque or cash to the District of 100 Mile House.

The Cost is \$800.00; this covers the cost of the tree, site preparation, administrative costs, planting, and Bronze Plaques to be mounted on a concrete pad at the foot of the tree.

All tree planting is done in the Spring

All Memorial Trees become the property of the District of 100 Mile House; such tree doesn't constitute ownership of the land upon which is situated or the surrounding lands.

Memorial Tree Donations

The Community Service Department will accept trees donated by the public for memorials to be planted in the appropriate locations in the District of 100 Mile House for a fee. The following guidelines will apply:

- ! Tree caliber must be at least 2 inches or 5 cm.
- ! Tree height must be at least 6 feet or 1.8 metres.
- ! All tree planting is done in the spring.
- ! All memorial trees become the property of the District of 100 Mile House and such tree does not constitute ownership of the land upon which it is situated or the surrounding lands.
- ! In instances where the tree does not survive the first season, one tree replacement will be provided. Replacement trees may or may not be of the same variety as that of the original donation.
- ! The District will not be responsible to replace plaques or trees if they are damaged or vandalized.
- ! The District reserves the right to remove any memorial tree and recognition plaque at any time. A reasonable effort shall be made to notify the donor if their tree is affected.
