Key Highlights included: - New Trail Groomer has been a success, Chris thanked Council for their contribution through the Grants for Assistance program - Overall good season with great conditions - Teck Cup Race was a success - Nordics are planning two days of racing in 2024, great community opportunity to showcase the north and winter as a destination - Nordics would like to continue to play a role in promoting tourism, recreation and outdoor activities. Working towards developing youth and family programs and Ski School program. - West Fraser has future plans of selective logging in the area, this will assist the Nordics in future trail development and planning - Currently 45 KM of trails that are being maintained, recent sign upgrades have been completed working with Rec Sites and Trails BC. - Volunteers are amazing but more are always needed and staffing can be a challenge. All user groups of the 99 Mile Recreation area share common struggles and the future goal is to bring all user groups together to promote 100 Mile House outdoor recreation activities. - Nordics are searching for ways to secure grant funding and other opportunities to support economic development and growth.
