RE: Burden of Delinquent Taxes

On behalf of the City of Merritt Council I am writing to highlight the impact of the *Community Charter* allowance for taxpayers to become delinquent on their property taxes over a period of three years.

Property tax arrears significantly impact the operating capability of small municipalities, which are then forced to significantly increase taxes or limit essential services.

During our meeting with the Minister and staff at UBCM, it was expressed that the ministry was unaware that property owners use the strategy of paying off one year of arrears to remove the property from the tax sale and that they do this year after year to avoid paying the total outstanding amount. To help broaden the ministries understanding of this issue and the impact it has on communities, we have polled other communities and heard from over 20 municipalities across the province including, Burnaby, Prince Rupert, Township of Langley, Hope, Metchosin, Comox, Mission, Golden and Rossland. These communities all report a similar systemic issue of repeat offenders who carry balances owing on their property taxes to the detriment of the greater community. Small municipalities like the City of Merritt cannot continue to subsidize non-payment of property taxes. At year end 2023, the City of Merritt was owed \$893,711 in outstanding taxes and penalties, this equates to 8% on our tax levy. The cost to a community is compounded when you factor in the 100's of hours of staff time required to contact property owners, conduct follow up calls and serve notice of the tax sale by small Finance departments that are often operating with minimal staff and limited resources. This impact will increase significantly with the upcoming implementation of enhanced requirements for notice of tax sales that will require municipalities to bare the cost of bailiff services without the ability to recover full costs.

We request that the Provincial government review and revise the *Community Charter* to relieve this unfair burden. Following are three potential tactics:

1. Reduce the number of years a property can be in arrears on their property tax or allow municipalities to run a deficit.









- 2. Assign a dedicated contact for municipalities to assist in dealing with properties that have escheated to the Crown and help remove them from property tax rolls expeditiously. Currently they linger on the rolls, accumulating tax levies that will ultimately have to be written off by the Ministry.
- 3. Implement a province-wide, cost-effective solution for municipalities to recover taxes owed by mobile homes. While we place liens through the registry, the property still needs to be sold or moved legally. Uncertain timing and the costs of legal action make future net recovery uncertain and challenging

Report, re: the annual Grant-In-Aid you have continued to make available to the 100 Mile House Flying Club

On behalf of the 100 MH Flying Club, we want to thank both the municipality of 100 Mile House and the Cariboo Regional District for making funds available to support our annual Young Aviator's Day.

On Sunday September 8th, we held our 12th annual event, this time welcoming some 26 High School kids for a free introductory flight.

Other years we've had over 40 kids signed up.

Sparking an interest in aviation to young minds has been the focus of our events.

Many rewarding careers in the field of aviation can be pursued.

Not just limited to becoming a pilot, there are also good careers in Air Traffic Control, Aircraft maintenance and repairs, dispatching, meteorology etc.

Prior to flight, we put the kids through a short seminar of "ground school" by one of our Club members.

We talk about aircraft control surfaces, what it takes to achieve a takeoff, theory of flight, engines and aircraft radios, licensing with Transport Canada, safety around aircraft and so on.

The flights generally takes about 30 minutes, during which we chat as to where the kids might reside and try and let them point out where they live.

The Club manages to bring on board some four aircraft for the event.

The flight route is pre-determined so everyone is headed in the same direction at a prescibed altitude.

The route this year was departing from 100MH, 108 subdivision, Lac La Hache, across to Forest Grove, then over to Horse Lake, 83 Mile to 93 Mile and back over the town of 100 MH for a landing.

The kids enjoy the flights tremendously, and even the parents are often very excited and take a lot of pictures upon deplaning.

Each student receives a Young Aviators Certificate with their name, together with their pilot's name and aircraft registration #.

The idea is for our little Flying Club to provide a 'spark' for choosing 'aviation' as a potential career.

Your funds were utilized toward providing multiple aircaft, fuel and logistics for the event.

All Flying Club members planning and participating in the annual event are un-paid volunteers.

The event's success is demonstrated by the number of parents and kids who show up. Over the 12 years , almost 380 kids have participated and become airborne.

We always put up a large recognizable CRD banner in a highly visible spot.

Please be advised that the Club once again has put forward another Grant application again for 2025. More details can be found there.

Bylaw No. 1424

A bylaw to provide tax exemption in accordance with Section 220 and Section 224 of the Community Charter for a five year term.

WHEREAS Division 6, Section 220 of the Community Charter exempts from taxation certain buildings and the lands on which the buildings stand;
